PART I 16TH-18TH CENTURIES

- 1. "Meletiy Smotrytsky was one of the most important figures in the history of Ukrainian literature as well as in the history of Ukrainian Church." Discuss.
- 2. The beginnings of Ukrainian theatre.
- 3. Discuss the <u>litopys</u> genre of the Ukrainian Baroque.

PART II 1798-1861

- 1. Some Ukrainian Romantics viewed Kotlyarevsky sceptically and regarded his works as ridicule of the Ukrainian people. Discuss their objections.
- 2. Discuss briefly and illustrate Shevchenko's attitude to the Cossacks What was the impact of this attitude on other Ukrainian writers?
- 3. What was Marko Vovchok's main contribution to Ukrainian prose?

PART III 1861-1917

- 1. Discuss the literary situation in Ukraine in the 1860s.
- 2. "Ukrainian realism is the offspring of populism," Discuss and illustrate.
- 3. Discuss: Kotsyubyns'ky's prose reflects the various literary currents that permeated Ukrainian prose before 1917.

PART IV SINCE 1917

- 1. In what way is the literature of the 60's (Shestydesyatnyky) a continuation and / or a departure from the literary revival of the 20's?
- 2. Discuss the most notable literary processes in Western Ukraine in the inter-war period.
- 3. Mykola Kulish was the foremost Ukrainian playwright. Illustrate by a discussion of his "national trilogy".
